Oklahoma Statewide Runoff Survey Results

This memorandum is a summary of an automated voice recorded phone survey of 1058 voters in Oklahoma. The interviews were conducted on September 25 & 26, 2018. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.0% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The responses in this poll have been weighted by age, gender, and party. The respondents polled were a random sample drawn from our proprietary likely voter model.

*The Right Strategy Group does not publicly poll races in which we are working with one of the campaigns.
