DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR DISCOVERY

COMES NOW the Defendant, by and through his attorney of record, Stephen G. Fabian, Jr. for the firm, FABIAN & ASSOCIATES, INC., P.C. and moves the Court to require the District Attorney or City Attorney representing the Petitioner in the above Captioned Court, on behalf of the Plaintiff, or any assistant or other prosecuting attorney who may be involved in the above-styled and numbered cause, to disclose and produce for copying, all of the following information:

- 1. Pursuant to the Oklahoma Criminal Discovery Code, Okla. Stat. Tit. 22 § § 2001, 2002 (supp. 1996), the Defendant requests:
 - a. The names and addresses of any and all witnesses the State intends to call at trial along with their written or recorded statements or significant summaries of their oral statements;
 - b. All Law enforcement reports made in connection with this case;
 - c. Any and all written or recorded statements made by the Defendant and the substance of any oral statement the Defendant made;
 - d. The reports or statements made by any experts in connection with this case: including physical or mental examinations and scientific tests or experiments or comparisons;
 - e. Any books, papers, documents photographs, or tangible objects, buildings or places which were obtained from the Defendant;
 - f. The record of any past criminal convictions of the defendant; and,
 - g. OSBI rap sheet/records check of any witnesses the State, or the Defendant, intends to call at trial.
 - h. Any and all records of the Medical Examiner regarding this case.

CHEMICAL TESTING

i. All documents, evidence, scientific evidence, including but not limited to Chemical or other tests performed on the defendant, including any and all documents reflecting any information regarding Creation of Standards, Purchase orders for any and all other equipment used in the performance of any chemical test to be used against the Defendant, and any and all maintenance and repair records for any equipment or machines used to test the Defendant or his blood, breath, urine or saliva for the past year.

- j. Certified copies of all Intoxilyzer, Breathalyzer, Blood, Urine or Saliva operator, chemist, or maintenance supervisor licenses/permits issued from any source, to any individual performing or analyzing the results of any such test.
- k. All records dealing with the operational procedure, adopted, approved, promulgated and/or prescribed for use with the Intoxilyzer Models 5000D or 8000 and by the Oklahoma Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence or the State Director of the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence.
- 1. A list of all schools, workshops, seminars, etc., for any person or persons administering or analyzing any sample of bodily fluids or breath of the Defendant that were attended by such person or persons to qualify for a maintenance supervisor permit, to maintain said permit, or to expand his knowledge of Intoxilyzer, Breathalyzer operation or maintenance, or the operation or maintenance of any other equipment used to perform any such Chemical test.
- m. A list of all schools, workshops, seminars, etc., that any person testing the Defendant has attended to qualify for his or her Intoxilyzer or Breathalyzer operator's permit, has attended to maintain said permit, or to expand his knowledge of Intoxilyzer and Breathalyzer operation or maintenance.
- n. Certified copies of all Intoxilyzer or Breathalyzer operators licenses/permits issued to any person testing the Defendant by the Oklahoma Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence.
- o. All training and instruction Manuals (Cover Sheet and Index) used in the training of the person performing a chemical test on the Defendant or on any evidence obtained by the State.
- p. All Source code for the Software which is resident on or located in any E-prom device used on the Intoxilyzer Model 5000D or 8000 and controls the operation of the Intoxilyzer Model 5000D or 8000 Machine which was used to perform a breath test on the Defendant.
- q. All Maintenance records and downloads from the Intoxilyzer Model 5000D or 8000 used to test the Defendant from its date of .
- r. All Data stored in the Intoxilyzer Model 5000D or 8000, at the time of testing, or used by the Intoxilyzer Model 5000D or 8000, including but not limited to Breath Volume, velocity and duration, at the time of the test of the Defendant.
- s. All of the data from all of the records for all of the files used in the Intoxilyzer 5000 or 8000 for the breath test on the captioned Defendant, This includes, but is not limited to: subject files, maintenance files, diagnostic files, calibration files, operational error files, quick tests and instrument files. NOTE: File names may not be exactly as requested but the intent of this item is to receive all data files. Any data fields, records or files that are provided must be clearly identified, and should be provided in electronic (digital) format, capable of being accessed by Microsoft Excel or similar generic Spread Sheet Program.
- t. All O.S.B.I. Records regarding this analysis of blood of the Defendant, as indicated by the Attached List Exhibit "A".

FIELD SOBRIETY TESTING AND DRUG RECOGNITION EVALUATION IF ANY

All of the data from all of the records for all of the files used in the Portable Breath Test equipment used on the Defendant at the time of his arrest to test his breath for alcohol, This includes, but is not limited to: subject files, maintenance files, diagnostic files, calibration files, operational error files, quick tests and instrument files. NOTE: File names may not be exactly as requested but the intent of this item is to receive all data files. Any data fields, records or files that are not provided must be clearly identified, and should be provided in electronic (digital) format, capable of being accessed by Microsoft Excel or similar generic Spread Sheet Program.

Furthermore, pursuant to the Code, the defendant requests the disclosure of any evidence favorable to the defendant with regards to guilt or punishment;

The Following Items Concern General Matters:

- 1. A copy of any accreditation certificates for the laboratory that were in effect at the time of the analysis.
- 2. The laboratory's overall policies as to testing and calibration.
- 3. The laboratory's overall procedures as to testing and calibration.
- 4. The policy that applies to the section of the laboratory where this particular testing or calibration event occurred.
- 5. The procedure that applies to the section of the laboratory where this particular testing or calibration event occurred.

The Following Items Concern Pre-analytical Matters:
