## NARRATIVE No: 1 - Officer: MASHORE, JEREMY

On Wednesday, September 28, 2022, at approximately 0335 HRS, In the State of Oklahoma, County of Oklahoma, Town of Valley Brook, I, Officer Jeremy Mashore, a CLEET certified peace officer in and for the State of Oklahoma, commissioned and employed by the Valley Brook Police Department, was at the Valley Brook Police Department, within Valley Brook, Oklahoma 73149, and within the corporate town limits for the Town of Valley Brook, Oklahoma. During that time, I had, within minutes, recently returned from a disturbance at the Deja Vu Entertainment establishment, located at 1540 Southeast 59th street, Valley Brook, Oklahoma, 73149. During that time, I had spoken with DUSTIN BRADLEY HAND DOB [REDACTED] (SUSPECT), and others regarding an altercation inside the building.

Furthermore, Mr. Hand indicated he had been drinking earlier in the evening, and upon inquiry, on a scale of one to ten, one being stone cold sober ready to go to church, and ten being drunk and passed out in a ditch, Mr. Hand stated he was at approximately a "three". Therefore, I advised Mr. Hand no charges would be filed against him at that time, and asked him to get a ride to take him home, one for safety, and two so he would not be drinking and driving. Mr. Hand agreed, I departed the area, and drove to the Valley Brook Police Department.

Thereafter, upon arrival at the police department, I exited my patrol car and stood in the back parking lot momentarily, to which I could see the club, and Mr. Hand still standing near the door. No other vehicles were arriving at that time for him, whereas I observed Mr. Hand began walking towards the parking lot. I entered my patrol car, and began driving back over to the club, this time, in the Little Darlings Entertainment Establishment parking lot, to which was closed, and is located at 1500 Southeast 59th street, to which is within the 1500 block of Southeast 59th street, Valley Brook, Oklahoma, 73149.

Thereafter, I observed a gray in color Dodge, bearing Oklahoma License Plate [REDACTED] to which was the only operational motor vehicle in the parking lot or area, and there did not appear to be anyone else in the area, nor did I see Mr. Hand in the area, thus I was led to believe he was in the vehicle in the parking lot. However, I did not physically see him at that time, therefore, I drove towards the vehicle, whereas the operator was now driving northbound through the parking lot only, and nearly drove over the curb into the 1500 block of Southeast 59th street, in that, the physical roadway from the parking lot. Upon driving closer, I observed the operator placed the vehicle in reverse, stopped, began driving forward to Plaza Mayor street, then stopped, and began backing into two parking spaces at the same time, to which the operator then re-parked the motor vehicle in the Little Darlings Entertainment Establishment parking lot.

I activated my red and blue lights, exited my patrol car, and once the vehicle stopped and parked, I observed Mr. Hand was the driver. I was astound a law enforcement officer, after having been given such a large break from the fight incident, to which he had indicated he pushed another individual first, admitted he had been drinking, agreed to get a ride to go home, was now in actual physical control of a motor vehicle. I exited my patrol car, approached the vehicle, and questioned Mr. Hand as to why he would be operating the vehicle if he had already been asked to get a ride home, then began attempting to operate a vehicle himself. Yet, the only answer he could rationally provide was the mere fact he was parking the vehicle, although it was previously already parked before he began operating prior to the arrival of a sober person to drive him home.

Therefore, I requested Mr. Hand to exit the vehicle and he did so. I requested Mr. Hand to participate in Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, to ensure safe operation or actual physical control of a motor vehicle and he agreed. Mr. Hand stated he did not have any recent medical injuries or brain trauma, and he did not have major difficulty with walking or balancing daily. Further, Mr. Hand was not wearing corrective lenses or contacts during any of the examinations he participated and performed, although he stated he does utilize corrective lenses frequently, and later indicated he could see the tip of my stimulus the entire time, that is, when completing eye examinations.

I instructed Mr. Hand into the instructional stage of feet together heel-to-heel, toe-to-toe with arms down at his sides. In addition, I instructed Mr. Hand to remain in that position until told to do otherwise, and he acknowledged understanding by stating "yes" when asked. I then raised my stimulus or pen approximately 12-15 inches in front of his face and just above eye level, when inquired, Mr. Hand stated he could see the tip of my pen. Following, I began checking for equal tracking, equal pupil size, and resting nystagmus. Upon conclusion of these preliminary tests, I observed Mr. Hand did have equal tracking, did have equal pupil size, and there was no resting nystagmus observed. Furthermore, Mr. Hand's eyes appeared bloodshot, watery, glossy and glazed, and he did have droopy eyelids or ptosis.

Mr. Hand participated in the first examination of the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus, and he did complete the examination. Additionally, Mr. Hand did present a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, did present distinct and

sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes, and did present onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in his right eye only. Upon completion of this eye examination, I observed Mr. Hand did have five out of six possible clues in both eyes, there was no vertical nystagmus observed in either eye, and notably, Mr. Hand did look away from the stimulus at times, along with his face was swelling on the left side from his altercation earlier in the evening.

Following, Mr. Hand participated in the walk and turn psychophysical examination, and he did complete the examination. I requested Mr. Hand to walk over to a yellow parking line stripe in the parking lot and he did so. Once there, I instructed Mr. Hand to place his left foot on the line and he did so. Mr. Hand was then instructed to place his right foot in front of his left foot, touching heel-to-toe, place his arms down at his sides, and remain in the position until instructed to do otherwise. Further, Mr. Hand acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes".

Further, I instructed Mr. Hand when told to do so, and only when told to do so, to take nine heel-to-toe steps up his straight line, on his ninth heel-to-toe step, keep his lead foot planted, turn around by conducting a small series of steps, and go back nine heel-to-toe steps. I demonstrated this segment for Mr. Hand, and he acknowledged understanding by stating "yes". Lastly, I instructed Mr. Hand to look down at his feet, count his steps out loud, keep his arms down at his sides, touch heel-to-toe, and to not stop walking until the test was complete. Mr. Hand acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes".

Upon Mr. Hand's completion of the psychophysical examination, in adept with two portions, the instructional stage, and the walking stage, I observed the following clues from the testing. During that time, Mr. Hand Could not keep balance during the instructional stage. This test concluded with a total of one clue out of a possible eight. Furthermore, Mr. Hand was wearing shoes when he completed the testing.

In addition, Mr. Hand participated in the one leg stand psychophysical test, and he did complete the examination. I instructed Mr. Hand to place his feet together heel-to-heel toe-to-toe with arms down at his sides, and to remain in that position until told to do otherwise. Mr. Hand acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes". Further, Mr. Hand was instructed he may choose whichever leg he preferred, and whichever he felt was strongest to complete this examination. Further, I instructed Mr. Hand when told to do so and only when told to do so, to lift the leg he preferred approximately six inches off the ground where he would begin counting in the following manner one thousand one, one thousand two, one thousand three, and so on and so forth until told to stop. Mr. Hand acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes".

Following, I demonstrated the psychophysical test for Mr. Hand, and again, he acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes". Mr. Hand was further instructed to look down at his raised foot, count his numbers out loud, keep his arms down at his sides, keep his legs straight, keep his raised foot approximately six inches off the ground, and keep his raised foot parallel with the ground by pointing his lead toe at the ground. Mr. Hand acknowledged understanding when asked by stating "yes".

Upon Mr. Hand's completion of the psychophysical examination, in adept with two portions, the instructional stage, and the balance and counting stage, I observed the following clues from the testing. Further, Mr. Hand presented one clue, swaying, out of a possible four clues. Additionally, Mr. Hand was wearing shoes when he completed the testing.

Some of the major and general indicators observed during this traffic investigation were of the following: Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus, pupil size normal, Droopy eyelids, Drunk-like behavior, slurred speech, admitted to drinking alcoholic beverages, and an odor consistent and commonly associated with an alcoholic beverage on his breath and or person.

Based on my training and experience of DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, adept with Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE), and Drug Recognition Expert training, It is my opinion as a Nationally Certified Drug Recognition Expert that Mr. Hand had some type of intoxicant within his body, and was not safe to be in actual physical control of a motor vehicle. This is based on all the events observed and evidence obtained during the entire traffic investigation.

Furthermore, based on the totality of the circumstances, I instructed Mr. Hand to turn around and place his hands behind his back, and he did so. I placed handcuffs on Mr. Hand and advised him he was under arrest, contacted Chief Michael Stamp and Captain Darren Johnson, both of the Valley Brook Police Department, along with Captain Tom Evans of the Edmond Police Department. I notified all supervisors of the situation, and all of the events that had led up to this unfortunate point.

Thereafter, I requested Car Cab Wrecker Service to our location, and began completing a vehicle impound inventory of the vehicle. During that time, in the glovebox of the motor vehicle, I located a .40 caliber, tan and black in color, semi-automatic handgun, to which did have a fully loaded magazine inserted into the firearm, however, there was not a round in the chamber. Likewise, an additional magazine filled with ammunition was collected and or seized, and secured in the front seat of my patrol car. Later, Car Cab Wrecker Service did arrive on scene, and they did take possession of the motor vehicle upon their arrival, whereas I began transporting Mr. Hand to the Valley Brook Police Department for processing.

Upon arrival, truthfully, I wanted and desired for Mr. Hand to prove my suspicions wrong. First, I requested he submit to a Portable Breath Test or PBT. Mr. Hand refused stating he did not think it was necessary. Therefore, I read Mr. Hand the Implied Consent Test Request or States Test (Effective 11/01/2019), and again he refused to submit to the states test. Following, I processed and secured Mr. Hand in a holding cell at the department. Likewise, I completed a refusal affidavit, he did sign and he was served at the police department in the holding cell. Furthermore, Mr. Hand was read his Miranda Rights in the event he made any spontaneous statements. Lastly, all evidence or contraband was taken inside the department, processed, and secured within an evidence storage locker.
