Commissioner Keith Excluded by Far Left Democratic Party Activists

TULSA, OK - Today, Commissioner Keith's campaign for mayor of Tulsa was officially denied access to Democratic Party voting lists and voter turnout operations. Following a vote on September 5 by Democratic activists, who shared an extreme anti-democracy agenda during a public meeting, Keith was ostracized and cut out of the Democratic Party due to her commitment to bipartisanship.

"Like a lot of Tulsans, I value common sense and collaborating with my neighbors to get things done. As I've said all along, the issues we face as a city are not red or blue, and there's nothing we can't overcome if we work together," said Keith.

Keith's very liberal opponent, Monroe Nichols, maintains access to Democratic Party lists and resources.
